#### From the Principal's Desk ..

**WELCOME TO OUR LATEST EDITION** – I trust that everyone has valued the additional time with their families during the recent public holidays. I want to extend a big shout-out to our hardworking staff who have dedicated themselves tirelessly over these past weeks. This acknowledgment includes not only our teachers and teacher aides for their efforts in education and behaviour management but also our administrative personnel, cleaners, tuckshop staff, and volunteers.

CHANGES IN LUNCH ROUTINES – PLAY FIRST, EAT SECOND – As of Monday 20th May we will be implementing changes in our lunch time routines for a trial period until the end of the term. By allowing students to play first and then eat during lunch breaks, we are creating a positive shift in students routine which will lead to various benefits like increased consumption of lunch, improved behaviour, enhanced focus on eating, and decreased food waste.

Here's a breakdown of the changes during the trial period:

Tuckshop: The tuckshop will be opening and serving healthy snacks, providing students with nutritious options to enjoy during their breaks, please refer to Quickcliq and our Facebook change for updates around our menus.

First Break Eating Time: Students will have designated time to eat during their first break, allowing them to refuel before continuing their activities.

Transitioning Time: This time will be allocated for students to take care of personal needs like using the restroom and grabbing a drink, ensuring they can comfortably transition from playtime to eating time.

Second Break Eating Time: Similarly, students will have a designated time to eat during their second break, giving them another opportunity to replenish their energy.

Transition Time: This transition period will allow students to take care of personal needs once again before returning to their activities.

These changes are well-structured to support the overall goal of promoting healthier eating habits and maximizing the benefits of the students' breaks. It'll be interesting to see how the trial period unfolds and what impact it has on the students' overall well-being and behaviour.



#### **Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)**

#### Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need. AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
